



Having a place to go to memorialize a child nurtures the healing process and brings a sense of peace to those who mourn. The Memorial will also serve as a lasting tribute to the sanctity of each unborn child created in the image of God.

## About our Mission

The Kentucky Memorial for the Unborn provides a place of remembrance for unborn babies lost through the tragedy of stillbirth, miscarriage or abortion. Families can honor their children at this unique hallowed place of closure and find peace and comfort in a loving God.

The Memorial is located in historic Frankfort Cemetery on a serene bluff that overlooks the Kentucky River and the state capital. The cemetery is located at 215 E. Main St., Frankfort, KY.
